STUDENTS WILL DISCOVER AN INTENSE CLASSROOM LEARNING ATMOSPHERE WITH MANY HOURS OF INDEPENDENT STUDY. THE SUCCESS OF EACH SESSION IS DEPENDENT ON THE PREPARATION AND PREPAREDNESS OF THE STUDENTS.

FOLLOWING SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION, STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO SIT FOR NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION IN CRITICAL CARE TRANSPORT: CCP-C AND/OR FP-C.

STUDENTS ARE **REQUIRED** TO ATTEND A MINIMUM OF **ONE CLASSROOM SESSION PER WEEK (6 HOURS)** AND SHOULD PLAN ON AN ADDITIONAL 20-30 HOURS OF STUDY TIME EACH WEEK.
